Relative to commending Petty Officer First Class Tungu S. Carver for her service and dedication as Lead Petty Officer of Patient Administration's Medical Records Division of Naval Hospital Guam and extending a warm *Un Dangkolo Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase'* and best wishes on her new duty assignment.

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF**
2 ***I MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS**, Petty Officer First Class Tungu S. Craver, a native of Dallas,
4 Texas, she joined the Navy in April 1996. After basic training in Great Lakes, she
5 completed Hospital Corpsman "A" school in Great Lakes, Illinois. In the years that
6 followed, she received a Bachelor of Science from Southern Illinois University in
7 Carbondale in 2001; and

8 **WHEREAS**, her first overseas assignment was to Naval Hospital Okinawa,
9 Japan from 1996 to 1999, where she was assigned to the Pediatric Clinic and the
10 Immunizations Clinic. Ms. Carver was also stationed at Naval Hospital Sigonella,
11 Italy from 2002 to 2005 and Branch Medical Clinic, Diego Garcia from 2009 to
12 2010; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Tungu's shore duty assignments included Naval Hospital
2 Bremerton, Washington from 1999 to 2002 and Branch Health Clinic Washington
3 Navy Yards, DC from 2005 to 2009; and

4 **WHEREAS**, her first assignment as an Assistant Leading Petty Officer was
5 Naval Hospital Bremerton, Washington where she worked second shift in the
6 Supply Department 1999-2002, after September she was reassigned to the
7 Hospital's Auxiliary Security Force (ASF) until March 2002; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Carver later transferred to Naval Hospital Sigonella where
9 she was assigned one year to Medical Records, one year to Medical Logistics
10 Department and to one year to Biomedical Repair. Her next assignment was to
11 Branch Health Clinic Washington Navy Yards, Washington, DC; where she
12 worked in Medical Records, Audiogram Technician, Tricare Information Manager
13 and Customer Service Administrator then quickly transitioned a year later to
14 Dental Leading Petty Officer, before deploying to the Horn of Africa; and

15 **WHEREAS**, after returning from deployment she was assigned as Leading
16 Petty Officer of the Clinic's Medical Readiness Reporting System (MRRS) until
17 transferring in March 2009 to Diego Garcia; as the Medical Leading Petty Officer
18 until deploying in June 2010 to Kuwait. Ms. Carver's next assignment following
19 her deployment to Kuwait was working in the fast-paced Patient Administration
20 Department as the Assistant Leading Petty Officer until detachment in March 2011
21 to Naval Hospital Guam; and

22 **WHEREAS**, upon arriving at NH Guam Tungu was assigned as Leading
23 Petty Officer and Interim Department Head to the Operating Management
24 Department overseeing the Commands Communications (landlines, cell phones
25 and pagers), Security Clearances, Command Engraving Placards, Hospital
26 Security, Command Key Custodial Program and Fire Management Program; and

1 **WHEREAS**, later she transferred to Patient Administration's Medical
2 Records Division where she spearheading the reduction of a 12 year backlog and
3 implemented the closed records system that allowed the Division to maintain
4 positive control of the 22,000 records inventory. She enforced guidelines and
5 accounted for a 60 percent decrease in misplaced or lost medical records and
6 continue to enforce guidelines on a daily base; and

7 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Carver will now be transferred to Naval Reserve
8 Professional Development Center, New Orleans, Louisiana in April 2013 to carry
9 out her last duty assignment as an instructor until retirement; and

10 **WHEREAS**, in recognition of her superior work and service at Naval
11 Hospital Guam and other stations throughout her career, Petty Officer First Class
12 Tungu S. Craver has been recognized with four (4) Navy and Marine Corps
13 Achievement Medals, five (5) Good Conduct Medals, and a Navy Rifleman and
14 Navy Pistol Medal; and now, therefore be it

15 **RESOLVED**, the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Dos Na I*
16 *LiheSlaturan Guåhan*, does hereby, on behalf of *I LiheSlaturan Guåhan* and the
17 people of Guam, commend Petty Officer First Class Tungu S. Carver for her
18 service and dedication as Lead Petty Officer of Patient Administration's Medical
19 Records Division and extend a warm *Un Dangkolo Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase'* and best
20 wishes on her new duty assignment; and be it further

21 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on
22 Rules certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to the adoption hereof, and
23 that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Petty Officer First Class Tungu
24 S. Carver; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahren Guåhan*.
